BEFORE YOU CALL US

Before calling Nova Scotia Power to arrange for a free site consultation, be sure to complete these steps:

- Apply for a Municipal Building Permit
- Hire a certified electrician
- Have your house location and driveway marked/staked
- Get approximate distance from closest power pole to house site
- Ask your contractor if you need temporary service (electricity for power tools during construction)

Call us at **1-800-428-6230** to book a free site consultation (scope). We will determine where to install powerlines and if there are additional costs based on your requirements. This call will cover setting up a new account and ordering a meter.

WIRING REQUIREMENTS

Your electrician is responsible for permits and inspections at different stages of construction, including:

- Rough-in inspection: checks the wiring before the walls are finished
- **Service entrance inspection:** checks the electrical equipment on your house (or underground)
- Final inspection: checks the finished work before fully connecting power

Any work identified in the site visit and during installation (i.e. tree trimming, easements, rock breaking, line extension payment. etc.) must be completed before power can be connected.

YOUR POWER IS CONNECTED

After inspections and other requirements are done, your power will be fully connected.
